Notice is given under article 10 of the Town and Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995 that the Hertfordshire County Council as Highway Authority does not wish to restrict the grant of permission subject to the following conditions:

1. The intensity of illumination shall be controlled at a level that is within the limit recommended by the Institution of Lighting Engineers in the publication "Brightness of illuminated Advertisements" ILE Technical Report No 5. Reason: So that drivers of vehicles along the adjacent Mosquito Way are not dazzled or distracted, leading to interference to the free and safe flow of traffic along the highway.

COMMENTS: The proposal is for a historic beacon to be installed on land fronting Mosquito Way. The design and access statement states that only ambient lighting will be provided within the beacon however the inclusion of the above recommended condition will ensure that drivers of vehicles along the adjacent public highway are not dazzled or distracted, prejudicial to highway safety Hertfordshire County Council has no other highway issues as a result of this proposal.
