1. The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

2. The development shall not be started and completed other than in accordance with the approved plans and details: EC/83/01A & EC/83/02A & EC/83/03A & EC/83/04A received and dated 24 January 2011 unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

REASON: To ensure that the development is carried out in accordance with the approved drawings and any changes must be agreed in advance in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

3. The brickwork, bond, mortar, detailing, guttering, soffits and other external decorations of the approved extension shall match the existing dwelling, unless otherwise approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

REASON: To ensure a satisfactory standard of development in the interests of visual amenity in accordance with Policies GBSP2, D1 and D2 of the Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005.

### REASONS FOR APPROVAL
