Town and Country Planning Act 1990 PLANNING DECISION NOTICE – REFUSAL

Change of use of land to car washing, valeting (sui generis), works to include erection of a canopy

In pursuance of their powers under the above mentioned Act and the Orders and Regulations for the time being in force thereunder, the Council hereby **REFUSE** the development proposed by you in your application received with sufficient particulars on 28/11/2013 and shown on the plan(s) accompanying such application.

The reason(s) for the Council's decision to refuse permission for the development is/are:-

1. The applicant has failed to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority that the proposed development would not have a detrimental impact on the character and appearance of the application site or the surrounding area. Given the scale, height, design and siting of the proposed canopy, the development would appear as a prominent and incongruous addition within the streetscene. In addition, the proposal would result in material harm to the setting and visual amenity of the adjacent Grade II listed building. The proposed development would therefore not be compatible with the maintenance and enhancement of the character of the area and it would not preserve the setting of the area or make a positive contribution to the character and local distinctiveness of this locality. As such the proposed development would be in conflict with Policies D1 and D2 of the Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005 and the National Planning Policy Framework.

INFORMATIVE

Car wash liquid waste is classed as trade effluent.
