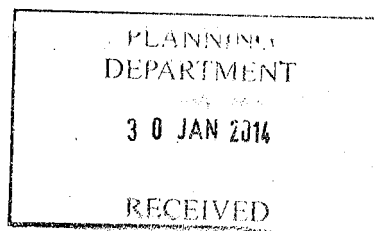

Proposal

Erection of new weld-mesh security fencing, two pedestrian turnstiles and disabled gate (including lighting of gates) and minor works to vehicular access

Decision

Notice is given under article 16 of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2010 that the Hertfordshire County Council as Highway Authority does not wish to restrict the grant of permission subject to the following conditions:

Condition 1. All storage and delivery of materials associated with the development should take place within the site and not extend in to within public highway. Reason: In the interest of highway safety

Note. The proposal is to erect perimeter fence and gates. The applicant should make sure that the fence is fully within the land in the ownership of the applicant. The application form indicates that the proposal involves alteration to the access arrangement. The drawing indicates that the proposed alteration involve erection of gate and possible minor alteration within the site and not on the public highway. Highway authority does not wish to restrict the grant of consent.
