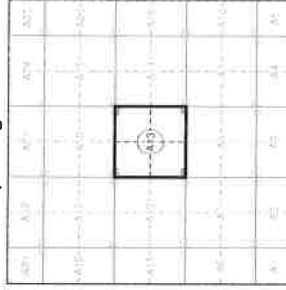

The published data were compiled from a number of different sources, including Ordnance Survey maps, which were often some years later than the surveyed date. Before 1938 all OS maps were in the Transverse Mercator Projection, with independent surveys of a single county or group of counties, giving rise to significant inaccuracies in outlying areas.

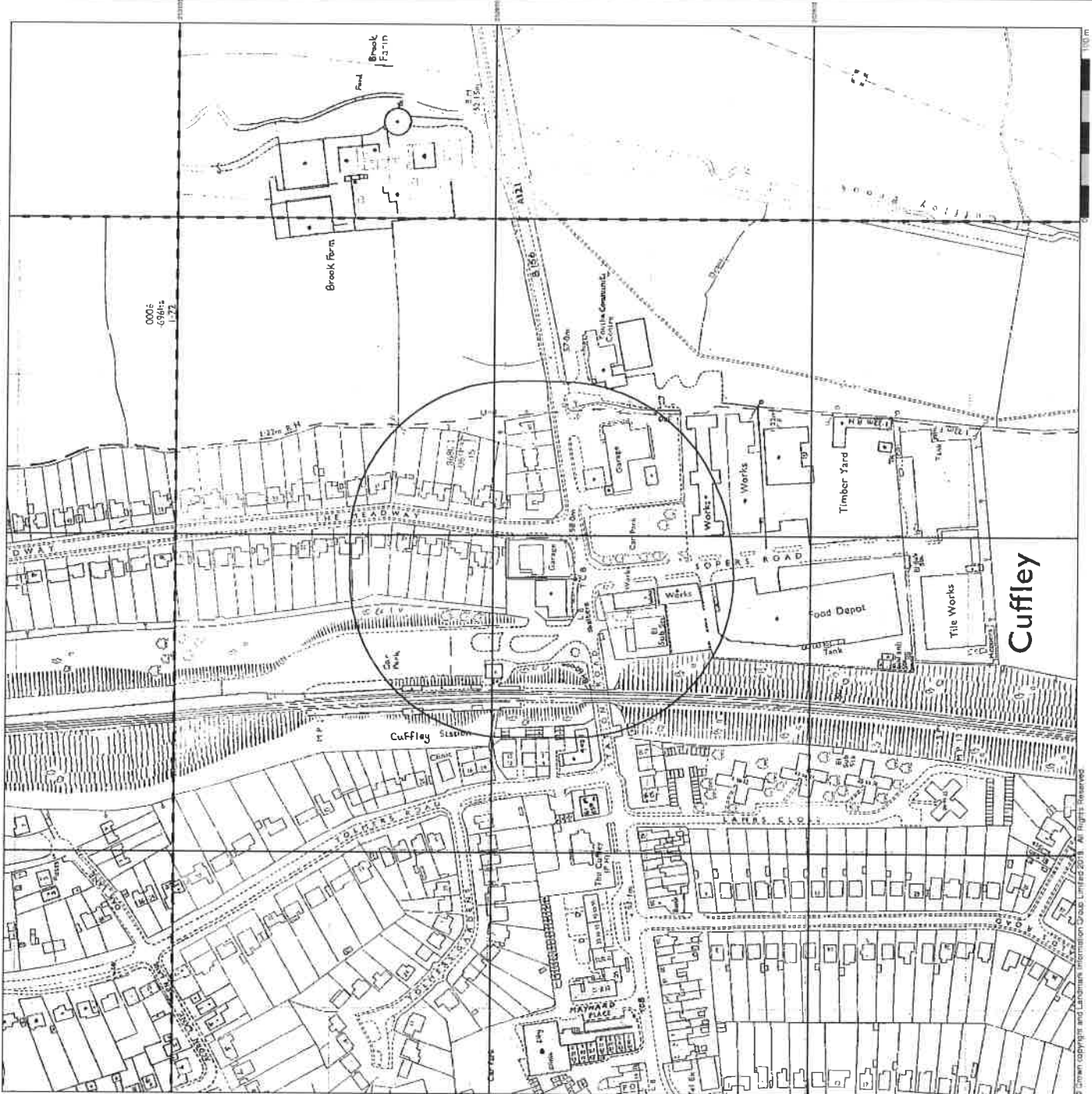

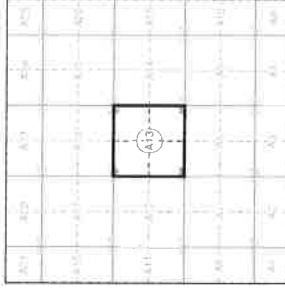

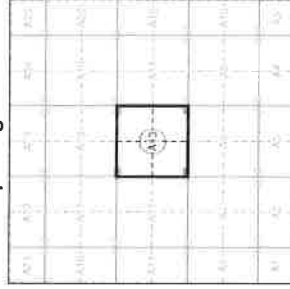

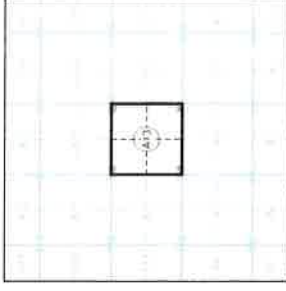
