

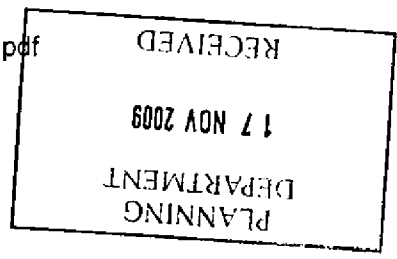

REFERENCE S6/2009/2047/FP

I refer to Mr Theanne's recent letter with his comments on our objections to his planning application. I must put on record that this letter misrepresents both the spirit and content of my conversation with him.

I spoke to Mr Theanne purely as a matter of courtesy to confirm that we had objected. The approach was friendly, and was not to discuss the plans or negotiate, but simply to attempt to avoid future bad feeling between us.

Mr Theanne has misreported the conversation: for example,

- There was no reference to a "compromise" height of 3m. This would still tower over the garden hedge and be an eyesore. The only "compromise" might be a flat roof, but he informed me back in August that this would be unacceptable as he needs to use the roof space in the "shed"
- There was no mention of the view from our back bedroom. This view was mentioned to him back in August when we first noticed the construction work taking place. We can now see that the building spoils the view from the whole of the rear of the house and garden, and so the effect on that one bedroom is now beside the point.

I am most concerned that Mr Theanne is attempting to put on record his interpretation of our objections and I would ask you to refer to our letter of objection as an accurate record.
