- Putting vulnerable children with complex needs that are already at risk in the neighbourhood is not a good idea
- 2. The proposed care home would attract anti-social behaviour
- 3. This is a quiet residential neighbourhood and should stay that way
- 4. The house has minimum private parking facilities.
- Existing traffic and parking problems would be exacerbated by the additional parking spaces required by resident staff, visiting professionals, and visiting relatives.
- 6. This is a family home not suited to this type of accommodation
- 7. Will cause a negative impact on neighbouring properties
- 8. Increase in noise and disruptive behaviour, property damage, physical harm and public disturbance from the children with complex needs occupying the property
- 9. Number of staff will be high and likely to be higher on frequent occasions than stated along with regular visits from social workers, clinicians, and other professionals
- 10. As the children will be unrelated this could mean multiple visits at one time
- 11. Increase in traffic
- 12. Will drive down house prices
- 13. Will make this a place that people do not want to live, and drive neighbours out of the area.
- 14. Likely to be a high turnover of children (as it will house children who have already had multiple placement breakdowns) and different staff
- 15. Not appropriate to bring people with potential substance and alcohol issues into a residential area where children play may not be safe for the existing children
- 16. Increase of police visits and other emergency services
- 17. These owners have tried to change use before and granting this change of use will set a precedent
- 18. Adversely affect the value of all the properties in Walker Grove
