The intensity of illumination shall be controlled at a level that is within the limit recommended by the Institution of Lighting Engineers in the publication "Brightness of illuminated Advertisements" ILE Technical Report No 5. Reason: So that drivers of vehicles along the adjacent Comet Way are not dazzled or distracted, leading to interference to the free and safe flow of traffic along the highway.

COMMENTS: Given the proposal involves the installation of an internally illuminated at the location shown on dwg no 1944-21B the above recommended condition will ensure that drivers of vehicles along the adjacent public highway are not dazzled or distracted, prejudicial to highway safety
