WELWYN HATFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL, in pursuance of powers under the above mentioned act, hereby GRANT, subject to the development beginning not later than 3 years from the date hereof to: -

Development: Change of use from 5 staff and 1 visitor bedrooms (class C2) to 6 resident bedrooms (class C2), provision of additional secure cycle storage to the rear and the retention of the reconfiguration of site layout/landscaping to provide 7 additional parking spaces and relocation of cycle storage

At Location: Hatfield Manor Care Home Hatfield Avenue Hatfield AL10 9UA

Applicant: Simply UK

Application Date: 6 April 2023

In accordance with the conditions listed below: -

1. The development shall not be carried out other than using the details of the hard and soft landscaping submitted to the Local Planning Authority under planning reference 6/2021/3192/COND and approved in writing on the 23rd February 2022. Subsequently, the approved details shall not be changed.

REASON: The landscaping of this site is required in order to protect and enhance the existing visual character of the area and to reduce the visual and environmental impacts of the development hereby permitted in accordance with Policies GBSP2, D2 and D8 of the Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005, Policies SP9 and SADM16 of the Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council Draft Local Plan Proposed Submission August 2016 and the National Planning Policy Framework 2019.

2. All agreed landscaping comprised in the above details of landscaping must be carried out in the first planting and seeding seasons following the occupation of the first building, the completion of the development, or in agreed phases whichever is the sooner: and any plants which within a period of 5 years from the completion of the development die, are removed or become seriously damaged or diseased shall be replaced in the next planting season with others of similar size and species. All landscape works shall be carried out in accordance with the guidance contained in British Standards 8545: 2014.

REASON: To ensure proper implementation of the agreed landscape details in the interest of the amenity value of the development in accordance with Policies GBSP2, D2 and D8 of the Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005 and Policy

SADM16 of the Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council Draft Local Plan Proposed Submission August 2016.

3. The development shall not be carried out other than using the details of the secure cycle parking as submitted within this application. Thereafter, the approved secure cycle parking must be fully implemented and made available for use and thereafter retained for this purpose.

REASON: To ensure the provision of adequate cycle parking that meets the needs of occupants of the proposed development and in the interests of encouraging the use of sustainable modes of transport, in accordance with Policies 1, 5 & 8 of Hertfordshire's Local Transport Plan (adopted 2018); Policies M6, M14 & D1 of the Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005; Policy SADM3 & SADM12 of the Draft Local Plan Proposed Submission August 2016; and the National Planning Policy Framework.

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WHAT IS BUILDING CONTROL?

Building Control ensures that architects, builders and other professionals in the construction industry adhere to the Building Regulations when designing and building structures. The Building Regulations set the standards for the design and construction of buildings to ensure that they are safe, accessible and energy efficient.

DOES MY PROJECT NEED BUILDING CONTROL APPROVAL?

Projects that involve extensions, structural changes, loft or garage conversions or changes to electrical wiring will - in the vast majority of cases - need Building Control certification. It is a legal requirement.

WHY DO I NEED BUILDING CONTROL?

There is a legal requirement that work carried out on buildings including alterations, extensions and loft conversions are inspected and certified by an authorised Building Control body. Building Control protects the interests of the property owner ensuring that architects and builders adhere to the standards required in the Building Regulations. Sadly, there are a number of rogue operators who will cut corners to save themselves money and in doing so cause buildings to be unsafe, difficult to access or exit, and energy inefficient. The building control surveyor is there to ensure that standards are adhered to and to certify the work carried out. This is not only important for you when living in your property but also when you come to sell it, as it could delay or prevent a sale if the appropriate certification has not been completed.

IS THIS DIFFERENT FROM PLANNING?

Building Control is separate from planning which deals with the appearance of buildings and how they fit into their environment. Your project may also need planning consent, which is a different process.

You may be receiving this advice note because you have submitted plans to your Local Authority planning department; if not you will need to contact them to discuss planning requirements. Links to contact Local Authority Planning departments are on our website.

WHAT DO BUILDING CONTROL SURVEYORS DO?

Building Control Surveyors work on behalf of the property owner and with architects, builders and other construction professionals to lead the compliance process, ensuring that buildings conform to Building Regulations. Essentially the surveyor protects the interests of the property owner and should therefore be independent of the architect and/or builder.
