	3 The trees in question are thriving.				
	4 Removing 6 trees from a small area could seriously impact the drainage. If there is subsequent heave or subsidence to our property will the council compensate us?				
	5 We maintain 2 similar trees without a problem. They are simply pollarded every 2 or 3 years. Why can't this continue to be done to these 6 trees as has been done for many years now?				
	6 No reason for removing the trees has been given in the application, nor is an applicant shown.

Main Issues			
Appropriateness of the works in relation to the tree(s)	2 of the 6 trees are situated within the boundary of number 11 Stanborough Close. Trees are situated to the rear of the property and form a small group with the 4 trees situated within 12 Stanborough Close. These trees are approximately 11m in height with a 3m crown spread. Trees		
	have been maintained as pollards and appear to be in good health. Trees are visible from all public spaces due to the height of the dwellings and breaks between surrounding properties.		
	The trees offer a suitable soft landscaping feature for the area and are ideal for maintaining as high pollards to continue adding character to the surrounding area.		
	Proposed works were inappropriate and justification is insufficient to remove the trees.		

Reasons for Refusal:

Conclusion

1. The work request is inappropriate and would result in the loss of landscaping that would harm the character and amenities of the area; contrary to Policy EM3 (Soft Landscaping) of the Welwyn Garden City Estate Management Scheme.
