Site and Application description	The application site is located at ground floor at the northern end of the Galleria and comprises the McDonalds outlet.				
•	The application seeks advertisement consent for the installation of 3No. new digital freestanding menu board signs and 1No. 15' digital booth screen at the cash booth in association with the McDonalds drive through service following the removal of existing. The three signs would be internally illuminated with one of the signs hosting a single screen measuring approximately 2.1m in height, 0.7m above floor level with a width of 0.85m and depth of 0.10m and the two double screen signs would have a width of approximately 1.6m.
