The application seeks planning permission for the erection of single storey rear extension which will replace an existing conservatory of similar size.				
The proposed extension would be located to the rear of the host dwelling and would not be visible within the streetscene, only to neighbouring properties at the rear. The size and design would not be an over prominent feature being a single storey extension and as such would not be a detrimental feature.				
The proposed extension being single storey would not appear at odds and would be subordinate to the host dwelling. The proposed materials are to match the existing dwelling so on balance, it is considered that the design would relate well to the host dwelling and it follows that there is no conflict with Policies GBSP2, D1 and D2 of the adopted Welwyn Hatfield District Plan 2005 insofar as these seek to ensure that development is designed to a high quality, respects local character and context and therefore considered to sufficiently preserve the character and appearance of the property and is compatible with the character of Hatfield. The proposal further complies with the National Planning Policy Framework in terms of design.

As the owner of the property, you are responsible for Building Regulations compliance so we would urge you to decide which regulator to use, as opposed to leaving your builder or architect to make the choice. This is so that you can be sure the building regulator is truly independent and working to protect you from any breach or omission during the works.
