Sand Grading

Extra Fine 0-1mm

Medium 0-3mm

Coarse 0-5mm (supplied with polypropylene fibres for added strength. Hair should be added on site).

Yield/Coverage

1no. 10 litre tub (coarse) will cover 0.8 m2 at 12mm

1no. 10 litre tub (medium) will cover 1.25 m2 at 8mm

1no. 10 litre tub (fine) will cover 3m2 at 3mm

1no. tonne bag (coarse) will cover 44m2 at 12mm

1no. tonne bag (medium) will cover 62m2 at 8mm

1no. tonne bag (fine) will cover 170m2 at 3mm

Preparation, Application & Curing

Clean and remove all dust. Adequately dampen dry or high suction surfaces.

Lime putty plaster is usually applied in three coats.

A coarse putty plaster scratch coat is applied,
straightened and keyed. A second coat of medium
grade putty plaster is applied to straighten the surface
ready for the Extra Fine finish coat.

Hair should always be added to putty plaster to improve strength. This is essential for plaster onto wooden lath.

Time between coats is 7 days minimum on lath and 5 days on masonry. The finish is applied when the previous coat is hard but still green. This may be between 2-5 days.

Do not use in temperatures less than 5 degrees or over 30 degrees. In warmer weather gently mist spray with water after application and cover if required with damp hessian. In cool weather cover fresh plaster with protective sheeting to help avoid frost damage.
