TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990 TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (APPLICATION) REGULATIONS 1988

Following an email from Highways dated 24/06/2022, regarding the above planning application we have examined the documentation provided and make the following comments:

ACCESS AND FACILITIES

Access for fire fighting vehicles should be in accordance with The Building Regulations 2010, Approved Document B - Vol 1.

- 1. It appears that a fire appliance will be able to gain access to the driveway via the entrance gates, it should be ensured there is a minimum width between gateways of 3.1 meters. (Table 13.1)
- 2. It appears that from the parked position of a fire appliance on the driveway (as shown on document PTP-21092-005) to the furthest part of the building is within the required 45 meters from the rear of the appliance.
- 3. The 45 meter access rule only applies to buildings therefore activities that are carried out in the rear garden in open air are not restricted by fire service access requirements.
