**Application Details:** Prior Approval for temporary use of the site (both the house and garden) for commercial film-making for no more than 9 months in any 27 month period.

### Conditions:

#### Noise from filming activities:

Ensure that all reasonable steps are taken to minimize noise intrusion to neighbours. If the filming schedule involves the playing of amplified music, the responsible party must ensure that this does not cause a statutory noise nuisance to neighbours. If noise complaints are received from neighbours then the responsible party must take a proactive approach in resolving the complaint.

Reason – to protect neighbours from noise intrusion.

#### Noise from plant equipment:

The use of plant and equipment such as generators, should only be used when alternative means of power are not available. The use of plant and equipment will not be permitted outside the hours of 07:00 to 19:00 Monday to Friday, 07:00 to 13:00 on Saturday and at no time on Sundays or bank holidays. The responsible party must ensure that the use of plant and equipment does not cause a statutory noise nuisance to neighbours.

Reason – to protect neighbours from noise intrusion.

**Lighting:**

Lighting systems must be used in such a way that light does not shine directly into any neighbouring properties. Care must be taken to prevent light intrusion and to ensure that a statutory nuisance does not occur at neighbouring properties.

Reason – to protect neighbours from light intrusion.
