We have previously objected (6/2019/0217/MAJ,6/2021/0071/LB)to the substantial harm to be caused to the listed mansion, stable block and locally listed historic landscape by the overdevelopment of this site. The addition of more houses as detailed in this application would seriously harm not only the Northaw House landscape but those of Nyn Park setting and the open approach to Northaw village. East Lodge was designed to be The lodge for the estate and it would harm its significance to put in further lodges of no historical relevance. The addition of houses along the East Drive would harm this historic designed parkland by removal of the essential gap between lodge and mansion where the drive runs through parkland. The development is contrary both to the provisions of the NPPF (Chapters 13 and 16) and WHBC's own policies on heritage and Green Belt."/>
