Decision

Notice is given under article 10 of the Town and Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995 that the Hertfordshire County Council as Highway Authority recommends that permission be refused for the following reasons:

The applicant has provided insufficient information to enable Hertfordshire County Council as highway authority to fully assess the impact of the proposal on highway safety and capacity

Comments The application is for the redevelopment of the old lido site in Stanborough Park to provide a wet play area, adventure play areas, an educational play area, high ropes attraction, changing huts, education room, cafe and toilet facilities. Associated with the proposals are alterations to the junction between the site access road and Stanborough Road.

The applicant has provided additional information in order to try and address the earlier concerns of the highway. In highway terms the key additional information appears to be a letter from Cracknell dated 15 May 2011. My comments below relate to this letter.

Trip generation: The PICADY analysis uses a figure of 322 pcus as arrivals/departures during the August weekend peak hour of 1400-1500. ie 166 arriving and 166 leaving, This appears to be based on the expected arrivals of 225 vehicle in the peak plus existing 245 arrivals to the car park. This would give a total of 470 arrivals in the peak hour, however this was reduced to 322 as that is the capacity of the car park. It is possible that in the peak time there will be more cars than the car park has capacity for entering the car park, as cars move around the car park looking for spaces and waiting while people exit.

Even accepting that the max number of arrivals is 322, the PICADY analysis has been based on half this figure and therefore does not present a robust analysis of the junction. Therefore it is not possible to assess whether the proposed right turn pocket is of sufficient size.

The letter of the 15 May states in paragraph 1.2.5 that 'car park full' boards will be placed on display by staff. This has not been discussed with the Highway Authority and raises concerns over the proposed location of such boards and whether they could lead to drivers trying to change lane at the last minute leading to an increased risk of collision.

Stanborough Road, the A6129 is a classified road designated as a main distributor. At the site access it is a 40mph two-way, single lane carriageway. The site access is currently a left in-left out junction with a central island to reinforce these traffic restrictions.

I consider that the letter of the 15th May does not address the concerns of the highway authority regarding the following;

1. The size of the right turning pocket may not accommodate all right turning vehicles. This will only be determined once the revised PICADY analysis has been carried out. 2. The design of the junction could encourage motorists to turn right out of the access road onto Stanborough Road leading to increased occurrences of collisions and this issue has not been addressed by the applicants. 3. The widening of the carriageway to allow a right turn lane will impact on the access into the southern part of Stanborough Park and could make this access road unduly steep.

These issues should be addressed prior to any permission being granted.

The Letter of the 15th states that the Green Travel Plan will be prepared in due course. The Green Travel Plan is considered an important part of the Transport Assessment process and I would expect at minimum an interim Travel Plan to be included with the application.

The above issues should be addressed by the applicant to ensure that the proposal will not impact on highway safety and free flow of traffic on Stanborough Road.
