Thank you for consulting us on the above application. We have **no objections** to this application.

## Advice to Local Planning Authority

The proposed development appears to sit within Flood Zone 2 as defined in table 1 of the Technical Guide to the National Planning Policy Framework and is therefore at risk of flooding. Please note that there are areas of Flood Zone 3 and 3b within the red line boundary of the site.

We have produced a series of standard comments for local planning authorities and planning applicants to refer to on 'lower risk' development proposals where flood risk is an issue to replace direct case by case consultation with us. This planning application sits within this category.

## **Advice to Applicant - Flood Risk Activity Permit**

This development may require an Environmental Permit from the Environment Agency under the terms of the Environmental Permitting (England and Wales) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2016 for any proposed works or structures, in, under, over or within 8 metres of the top of the bank of designated 'main rivers'. This was formerly called a Flood Defence Consent. Some activities are also now excluded or exempt. An environmental permit is in addition to and a separate process from obtaining planning permission.
