<b>Comments</b>	<input type="text" value="The s106 agreement for the establishment of Ellenbrook Country Park still hasn't been delivered despite a 20 yr delay. Hertfordshire County Council has failed in it's commitments and obligations to the residents of Hatfield and should deliver on the promised park rather than try and force yet more disruption and traffic congestion on an area that has had far more than it's fair share of development over the last few decades.
