Re: Erection of new teaching block, replacement tarmac play areas and additional parking provision | Stanborough School Lemsford Lane Welwyn Garden City AL8 6YR

ARCHAEOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS

Thank you for consulting us.

The Historic Environment Record (HER161) notes that archaeological investigations at Stanborough School have revealed a late Iron Age boundary ditch. Finds included pottery, a coin of Claudius and part of a La Tene III brooch. Evidence form later investigation suggests that the ditch was part of a large palisaded enclosure, probably a settlement. The site continued in use until the early Roman period, probably into the 2nd century. This is suggested by some human cremation burials which were found outside the enclosure.

We believe therefore that the position of the proposed development is such that it should be regarded as likely to have an impact on heritage assets with archaeological interest, we recommend that the following provisions be made, should you be minded to grant consent:

- 1. The archaeological field evaluation of the area of the area of the proposed development, prior to the commencement of works.
- such appropriate mitigation measures indicated as necessary by that evaluation. These may include:

- a) the preservation of any remains in situ, if warranted,
- b) appropriate archaeological excavation of any remains before any development commences on the site, with provisions for subsequent analysis and publication of results,
- c) archaeological monitoring of the groundworks of the development (also including a contingency for the preservation or further investigation of any remains then encountered),
- 3. the analysis of the results of the archaeological work, with provisions for the subsequent production of a report and an archive, and the publication of the results, as appropriate;
- 4. such other provisions as may be necessary to protect the archaeological interests of the site.

We believe that these recommendations are both reasonable and necessary to provide properly for the likely archaeological implications of this development proposal. We further believe that these recommendations closely follow the policies included within Policy 16 (para.199, etc.) of the National Planning Policy Framework. and the guidance contained in Historic England's Historic Environment Good Practice Advice in Planning Note 2 (2015).

In this case three appropriately worded conditions on any planning consent would be sufficient to provide for the level of investigation that this proposal warrants. We suggest the following wording:

A No development shall take place/commence until an Archaeological Written Scheme of Investigation has been submitted to and approved by the local planning authority in writing. The scheme shall include an assessment of archaeological significance and research questions; and:

- 1. The programme and methodology of site investigation and recording;
- 2. The programme and methodology of site investigation and recording as required by the evaluation;
- 3. The programme for post investigation assessment;
- 4. Provision to be made for analysis of the site investigation and recording;
- 5. Provision to be made for publication and dissemination of the analysis and records of the site investigation;
- 6. Provision to be made for archive deposition of the analysis and records of the site investigation;
- 7. Nomination of a competent person or persons/organisation to undertake the works set out within the Archaeological Written Scheme of Investigation.

B The development shall take place/commence in accordance with the programme of archaeological works set out in the Written Scheme of Investigation approved under condition (A)

C The development shall not be occupied/used until the site investigation and post investigation assessment has been completed in accordance with the programme set

out in the Written Scheme of Investigation approved under condition (**A**) and the provision made for analysis and publication where appropriate.

I note that an archaeological WSI for a previous planning proposal has been submitted with this planning application. Nevertheless we still recommend that the aforementioned archaeological conditions are attached to any consent.
