Hi Oliver,

I received a letter last week to notify me that Bourne Parking had submitted another planning application to install more lights at the Campus West Car Park.

I am unable to find any corresponding applications for removal of the Oak Trees. If there is an application please could you send me the reference so that I can comment?

If you see the screen shot of the planning application below, I have circled in blue one of the proposed new 6m tall street lights. This location of the application is visible from the public walkway and therefore I was able to walk along and view it.

As you will see from the 2 photographs that I have attached - there are overhanging oak trees that would prevent the installation of this size light. Unless they plan to pollard/remove it. But like I say - I can't find an application to that effect.

Please could you/someone from you team attend the site to ensure none of the other proposed lights are in places that would require the oak trees to me removed as the public are unable to access the site?

Is it the council responsibility to ensure Bourne Parking do not destroy the native woodland which forms part of the conservation area? Please let me know what action the council will be taking to enforce the protection of these trees.
