Herbs	Number	Height	Width	Planting Method	Aftercare
Basil	12	304mm - 609mm	203mm - 304mm	Plant basil outdoors in late spring/early summer when temperatures are consistently above 15°C. Plant into pots	Prefers a light and drained soil. Can only be grown outside in the summer months and needs to come inside in the winter, unless a green house is available. Needs a fertile soil with lots of warmth and light
Coriander	12	304mm - 558mm	101mm - 254mm	Planted into pots	Fertile soil in sunny portion, partial shade is preferable as shade helps prevent premature setting of the seeds.
Mint	12	304mm - 609mm	2000mm	Either grow in a bottomless bucket set in the soil as can be invasive, or grow in pots.	Prefers a light and moist soil, lots of sunlight and fertile soil.
Rosemary	12	1219mm	1219mm	Planted into pots	Fertile soil in sunny portion, partial shade is preferable as shade helps prevent premature setting of the seeds.

Blackberry	10	1524mm - 1828mm	4000mm	Ideal to plant in winter	Require regular watering during first growing season
Blueberry	Supplied by YMCA	1524mm - 1828mm	300mm - 3600mm	Plant between Autumn and Spring in container	Plant must be kept moist throughout growing season
Raspberry	5	2100mm - 2700mm	609mm - 914mm	Plant in ground or containers ideally in Autumn	Keep well watered in dry spells, specifically at ground level
Strawberry	Supplied by YMCA	150mm - 200mm	914mm - 1219mm	Plant mid spring to late summer. Space plants 35cm apart in rows 75cm apart, planting with the crown at soil level and watering well.	After harvesting, remove protective straw or matting and compost it or store for next year. Cut off old leaves, leaving the crown and new leaves intact to allow sunlight in and improve next crop. Ensure the plants are well-fed and watered

Bell Peppers	Supplied by YMCA	914mm - 1066mm	381mm - 457mm	Sow late March/early April. Keep indoor in warmth until late May	Water regularly
Beetroot		500mm	25mm - 27mm	Sow directly into moist soil and thin seedlings to about 5cm apart. Sow March to July and harvest May to September	Will require plant food and water to grow.
Broad Beans		914mm - 1371mm	750mm - 1000mm	Sow into small pots before planting out, or sow directly into the ground. Sow November to March and harvest June onwards	Pinch out the top few leaves when they reach about 3' tall to encourage the plant to produce more pods
Cabbage		304mm - 355mm	457mm - 609mm	Grow best in the ground, but can grow in large, deep containers. Sow in spring and summer. Plant takes up considerable room.	Water cabbage seedlings regularly, keeping soil moist. Once established, water every 10 days during dry spells
Garlic		609mm	152mm	Plant into well drained soil, lift when the foliage starts to grow back and dry in sun light before storing in cool, dry well-ventilated place. Sow spring and harvest late autumn	Maintenance free, plant on well drained soil and leave them to grow.
Onions		381mm - 914mm	100mm - 610mm	Plant into well drained soil, lift when the foliage starts to grow back and dry in sun light before storing in cool, dry well-ventilated place. Sow spring and harvest late autumn	Maintenance free, plant on well drained soil and leave them to grow.
Peas		609mm - 914mm <i>Climbing Peas (1828mm - 2438mm)</i>	152mm - 254mm	Sow March to June and harvest after two to three months. Support with canes & wire	The more you pick the ripe pods the more the plant will produce.
Potatoes		1000mm	152mm	Grow in potato bags, bins, or directly into the ground. Sow late February/march and harvest July to September	Cover shoots with more compost when they begin to come up. Keep well-watered and rummage out your spuds when foliage dies back.
Radishes		152mm - 457mm	76mm - 356mm	Sow directly into ground four weeks after last frost, and throughout summer, harvest four weeks later.	Keep watered
Runner Beans (<i>Climbing</i>)		2000mm - 3000mm	750mm	Sow into small pots before planting out/ sow directly into the ground. Train them onto runners or plant support frames. Sow April to July and harvest 2 months afterwards	Keep well-watered and when pods are ripe keep picking them and the plant will produce more pods. Regular picking is essential
Salad Leaves	80mm - 100mm	152mm - 457mm	Plant into pots. Sow throughout summer and harvest three weeks later. Plants produce leaves until late autumn.	Keep well-watered cut leaves when required	
Spring Onions	150mm	304mm - 609mm	Grow in pots or in the ground. Sow in March to July harvest after eight weeks.	Planting with mint will deter onion fly.	
Tomatoes	914mm - 1219mm <i>Indeterminates (1828mm)</i>	609mm - 914mm	Sow in bags, pots or hanging baskets between February & April and harvest July to October	Will need plant food and water to grow.	
Trees	Number	Height	Width	Planting Method	Aftercare
Wild cherry	2	4572mm - 9144mm		Plant in Spring / Autumn. Dig a hole 60x60cm (2x2ft) and 30cm (12in) deep. Add a layer of organic matter such as compost or well-rotted manure to the base of the hole and dig in. Water in well Stake windward side before planting	Water during prolonged dry periods in summer. Feed with a general granular plant food in spring. Remove dead branches avoid heavy pruning (July-Aug)
Pleached Hornbeam (<i>Carpinus betulus</i>)	8	3200mm	1200mm	Pot grown can be planted anytime of the year, clear weeds and grass within 1m of the planting hole. Dig a hole as deep as the root mass and twice as wide. Add rootgrow into the hole. Loosed roots and place into hole, ensure top of plants compost is flush with level of soil mix 50% of the original with 50% compost fill in hole and firm soil gently	water generously are base of plant. Use a staking kit and rabbit guard. Water well for the first couple of years especially spring and summer Keep are free of competing weeds and grass.

Centaurea Montana	40	300mm - 700mm	305mm - 458mm	Plant late Spring, Early Summer	Plant it in a sunny spot and water regularly
Evergreen	137	1000mm - 2000mm	6096mm - 9144mm	Ideal to plant in early Spring to mid Autumn	May need watering even during winter months when newly planted, but avoid applying water in frosty weather
Hellebore	209	305mm	610mm	Ideal time to plant from autumn to spring.	Watered regularly, especially during first growing season from spring to summer
Michaelmas Daisies	210	200mm - 1400mm	300mm - 900mm	Early spring is ideal	Will require additional water when planted to ground to make soil moist
Purple Clematis	24	750mm - 1500mm	1000mm	Best planted between spring to mid August.	Water thoroughly to soak the soil
Pink Clematis	45	750mm - 1500mm	1000mm	Best planted between spring to mid August.	Water thoroughly to soak the soil
Sunflower	12	305mm - 4572mm	45mm 105mm (The entire Head)	Spring is ideal period to plant.	To be watered thoroughly especially during summer

Berberis Thumbergii Atropurpurea	15	300mm - 1800mm	300mm - 1800mm	Between October & April (so long as ground is not frozen or waterlogged at time of planting)	Water regularly ensuring the first few months the top of soil is damp
Heather	24	610mm	610mm - 915mm	Best to plant in spring	Require regular watering for the first year if open ground

Clematis	92	3000mm	915mm - 1220mm	Best planted between spring to mid August. Root to be kept cool & moist, with support to climb	Water thoroughly to soak the soil
Hedge	Number	Height	Width	Planting Method	Aftercare
Hawthorn Hedge perimeter	94	762mm - 1220mm	3000mm	Best planted from autumn through to spring (Nov - March). Grow best in fertile, humus-rich soil that is moist but well drained. Dig Hole large enough for root spread no deeper than roots. Place so top of root collar is level with surrounding soil, back fill and firm in and water in. 5-8cm Mulch leave gap around stem	Should be watered regularly especially for first 2 years Lightly trim annually to shape and encourage growth (Feb-Mar) then every 2-3 years
