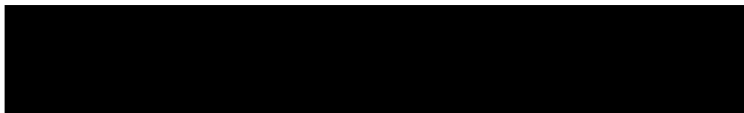

Thank you for your leaflet which was pushed through our door within the last few days. My husband and I live in Panshanger and you are one of our councillors.

I support the planning application N6/2010/2055/MA for Broadwater Road.

I believe that Tesco's plan for regenerating Broadwater Road with new jobs, a new Tesco store, swimming pool and a rebuilt footbridge to the rest of the town centre, can only be of benefit to Welwyn Garden City. I really cannot understand why there is so much opposition to Tesco's plans from people who appear to live mainly on the west side of the town! It won't affect their lifestyle, and they will still have Waitrose in the town centre and soon there will be a **huge** Sainsbury's, also in the town centre.
