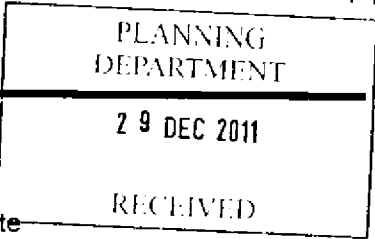

Proposal
Installation of 1 x fascia sign, 1 x projecting sign and 2 x window vinyls

Decision
Notice is given under article 10 of the Town and Country Planning (General Development Procedure) Order 1995 that the Hertfordshire County Council as Highway Authority does not wish to restrict the grant of permission subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The intensity of illumination shall be controlled at a level that is within the limit recommended by the Institution of Lighting Engineers in the publication "Brightness of illuminated Advertisements" ILE Technical Report No 5.

Reason: So that drivers of vehicles along the adjacent highway are not dazzled or distracted, leading to interference to the free and safe flow of traffic along the highway.

In addition to the above condition I recommend inclusion of the following advisory note to ensure that the works within the highway are carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Highway Act 1980. AN1. Notwithstanding the consent issued under the Town and Country Planning Act, a licence issued under the provisions of Section 177 of the Highways Act 1980 is required prior to the erection of any part of the projection into or over the public highway. The applicant is advised to contact the Mid West Herts Highways Area Office (01727 816000) to obtain the requirements on the procedure to enter into the necessary licence agreement with the highway authority, Hertfordshire County Council.

COMMENTS: The proposed signage as shown on drawing KL-06-0610-SF has no implication on highway safety. The height above the footway and clearance to the edge of the kerb as shown meet the requirements of the Highway Authority and would not affect the free passage of pedestrians.
