HIGHWAYS ENGLAND has been appointed by the Secretary of State for Transport as strategic highway company under the provisions of the Infrastructure Act 2015 and is the highway authority, traffic authority and street authority for the Strategic Road Network (SRN). The SRN is a critical national asset and as such we work to ensure that it operates and is managed in the public interest, both in respect of current activities and needs as well as in providing effective stewardship of its long-term operation and integrity.

This response represents our formal recommendations with regard 6/2021/0671/MAJ and has been prepared by Penny Mould.

Our formal response to this application requires the applicant to produce an addendum to the Transport Assessment setting out the development proposals impact on the SRN. For this reason, we require additional time to fully assess the proposed development. We therefore recommend the application be not determined before 10th June 2021. If we are in a position to respond earlier than this, we will withdraw this recommendation accordingly.
